Although there are ways for hackers to get email addresses from forms, it is way more difficult and forms are a lot safer way to get visitors to your site to contact you. You might want to consider this, as it is relatively simple to implement. I have dealt with numerous web hosting providers and every single one so far provides at least a minimal form email solution, plus I have found other solutions in my meandering around the web.
