


<u>Control Panel</u> – There is an icon in the Control Panel specifically for controlling your mouse. If you go there, you will see something similar to the following:

There are numerous features here, but I am concentrating on visibility, so I will only discuss a few. If you select Pointers, you will see that Windows has provided quite a few separate "schemes" of pointers in various sizes and colors:



I have selected Windows Standard (extra large) (system (scheme), since I want my mouse to be as big as I can get it so it is easier to see. Even so, sometime the "extra large" mouse seems to be hiding away somewhere on my desktop. For this, there are Pointer Options:



As you can see, I have highlighted 2 options that will help in finding that pesky rodent.

If you select "Display pointer trails", when you move your mouse it leaves a trail of pointers in its wake, making it much more noticeable. You can adjust this setting so you would see a lot or just a few trailers.

The other option is pretty cool in that, if you don't see your mouse right away, just press the "Ctrl" key and an animated circle displays over your mouse.

Hopefully these steps will be helpful if you find yourself looking all over for your mouse.
